### Parish Council Meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> November at 7.45pm** in the Village Hall.

Members of the public are welcome at Parish Council meetings and there is an allocated slot in which residents can bring any issues to the attention of the Parish Council.

### Speeding

The PCSO attended the meeting and reported that the Safer Roads Partnership Team had made 11 visits to the Village to carry out 17 hours of monitoring on the Alcester to Evesham Road. During that period 249 notices were issued, an average of 14 per hour.

The Safer Roads Partnership Team reported that the road had one of the biggest problems in the County for speeding and is looking into ways to resolve this problem.

They are also monitoring school parking and reminding people not to park on the double yellow lines. How to get in touch with the Team.
